She's also strengthening the district's ties to community groups that do environmentally-focused work in the schools. Farah took me to a few of the schools with very successful [gardening programs](#) and those that are going to begin or strengthen green teams with their students. We also toured the new "Met," a high school focused on job experience through internships, which is being renovated to LEED standards.

It was great to be with Phoebe and Farah in their day-to-day lives, and it was very helpful to meet the individuals they interact with regularly. The Center is looking forward to the great work these two will do in 2012!
