Los Angeles, Calif. - (Oct. 17, 2012) - The [Center for Green Schools](#) at the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) and the [Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education](#) (AASHE) today announced the [University of Wisconsin - Madison](#) as the winner of the 2012 Innovation in Green Building Award. The award recognizes a leading college or university that is transforming the built environment and examines how the school is using LEED® as a tool for campus greening.

"The University of Wisconsin - Madison is trailblazing the type of innovative partnerships the higher education community needs to transform the built environment," said Rachel Gutter, director of the Center for Green Schools at USGBC. "We're proud to give this award to such a deserving school, and thank AASHE for their support in highlighting outstanding sustainability initiatives taking place at colleges and universities across the country."

The University of Wisconsin - Madison received the award for its innovative work on the Wisconsin Institutes for Discovery, a world-class research facility that houses twin interdisciplinary institutes, the private non-profit Morgridge Institute for Research and the university's Wisconsin Institute for Discovery, along with a public space for science that spans the main floor. This visionary building is designed to foster collaboration and innovation among all researchers and building occupants, and contribute to its mission of accelerating new knowledge and improving human health and well-being. The building includes interactive displays and civic spaces, three teaching labs for educational outreach, offices, research support areas and core research facilities.

"Sustainability in higher education continues to gain momentum and projects like these continue to raise the bar," said Paul Rowland, executive director of AASHE. "Our award winners have demonstrated a commitment to creating a better society for all of us and for future generations."
